Minutes From the Meeting of May 16, 2008

The May 16, 2008, Northern Ohio Regional Group meeting was called to order at 7:35 pm by President Foster Buchtel, New club members, Dan Burngasser and Glenn Burridge, were recognized, Also welcomed back were Bill and Mary Jo Bates, John and Betty Coleman, and Dave and Loretta Duda. Thanks for the cookies go to Barb and Bill Soltis. Noting that the April minutes had been published in the May "Headliner," President Buchtel invited a motion and second for approval, which were called by Craig Gorris and Barb Soltis, respectively. The Treasurer's report was provided by Anne Davis, and approved subject to audit. The club activities report was given by Jeep lacobucci. Who noted that there we have eight cars on board for the Presque Isle overnight tour on May 31st, and that the Annual Nifty Fifties Summer Classic Car Show is set for June 22nd. 





The Early Ford V8 Club of America Spring Quarterly Officers L Directors Telephone Conference Call Meeting April 26, 2008

Summary

Business Report: First quarter 2008 income flow was greater than expected and expenses lower, in part because of the delay of 1st quarter billings for the Web site expansion and accessories and book sales; magazine production costs are on track.

Web Site: New features have been added to the web. Members can now have secure access to their membership registration page personal data; renew memberships, verify and change addresses, phone numbers, and vehicle information. These changes will automatically change in the Cornerstone data files.

Accessory Sales: Book and accessory sales for the 1st quarter exceeded \$14,000. The Early Ford V-8 Cookbook will be available at the Grand National Meet.


New Restoration Books: The editors hope to have a mock up of the *revised 1932 Ford Restoration Guide* for the Grand National Meet, with printing beginning shortly thereafter: the target release date of the 1937 Ford Restoration Guide is early 2009; four of seven chapters of the 1952-53 Ford Restoration Guide are completed; data are being compiled for the 1935-36 Ford Pick-up Restoration Guide; and the 1949-50 Mercury Restoration Guide is again underway following a brief interruption.

National Director Elections: National Director Candidates for the 2009-2011 terms are still needed for the following areas: California/Southwest #1; Central; Northeast; and North Central. Any member wishing to be a candidate should contact National Director Arel Brown (315-376-7392 or arelbarb@gmail.com.

National Meets: The 2008 Grand National Celebration (Dearborn, MI), July 13-18, 2008, has over 400 registrations to date. Dates and locations for the 2009 National Meets are: Western, May 1-4, Fountain Hills, AZ; Eastern, June 24-27, Hartford, CT; and Central, August 24-28, Auburn, IN. The 2010 Eastern Meet will be at Charlotte, NC, June 24-36.

National Meet Guidelines: Recommended changes to the National Meet Guidelines presented by a Committee appointed for this purpose have been accepted by the National Board.
