MINUTES FOR THE MEETING



OF October 19

New policies instituted by the national club will help members of the board with some of the expenses for attending national board meetings. Craig also noted that 6-volt LED taillight bulbs are now available for our early V8s.

Barb Soltis reminded us that we will have a club tour this Sunday. Meet at the intersection of 534 and 224 at 11:00. We will caravan to Brown's Country Kitchen in Pennsylvania where Dave and Nancy Collette will meet us and guide us to a private car collection nearby.

Historian Bill Royer was not able to manufacture any history this month, but he is working on it. Membership chairperson Dick Deyling reminded us that club dues for 2008 are due. Dick informed Guy Shively that we will publish a new roster every other year. Guy still will do the cover for our roster.

SEMA representative Pat Rooney announced that there now is a national caucus of legislators who are supporters of old cars. This has to be good news for the old car hobby!

After many years of excellent service, Ruthie Canankamp is resigning as Sunshine Chairperson. Many, many thanks from all the members, Ruthie! Sunshine duties will be taken over by Barb Soltis and Georgene Iacobucci.

Webmaster Don Clink told us that he has added information on the Grand National meet to our website, including a registration form. He also has added information on Jeep Iacobucci's colorful racing history. Or was that Jeep's racy coloring history? John Swigart reminded us that the Christmas dinner will be held on December 8. There will be a sign-up form in the November newsletter. John must receive your check no later than November 30 if you plan to attend. Cost will be \$15 per person. President Foster Buchtel reported on the NORG board meeting that was held earlier today. Dick Deyling made a number of suggestions to the board regarding the recruitment of new members. Craig Gorris informed the board that the national club has membership kits that we might be able to use. We will consider publishing our "Tips and Tricks" on the website instead of in print. All present officers are willing to stand for re-election for next year. It was decided to ask Don Clink if he would consider running for vice president.

The meeting adjourned and guest speaker Preston Buchtel presented the program for the evening. He had a very useful list of things to think about, including the architectural style, probable uses (restoration work vs. storage), electrical requirements, placement of the garage on the property, workbench space, parts storage, trophy and memorabilia display, parts washing and car washing facilities, heating, cooling, plumbing, moisture control, and a host of other topics. 
informative presentation! We went home. Neal Garland, Secretary

McConnells Mill State Park, in Lawrence County, encompasses 2,546 acres of the spectacular Slippery Rock Creek Gorge. Created by the draining of glacial lakes thousands of years ago, the gorge has steeps sides and the valley floor is littered with huge boulders. A gristmill was built in the 1800s to harness the power of the water. The park is open from sunrise to sunset, year-round

Slippery Rock Creek is a Class II to IV river, depending on water level. Spring and Fall are the best time for boating.

Boaters generally start from Rose Point (US 422 bridge), outside of the park boundary, to Eckert Bridge, covering 2.5 miles with a portage around the dam at the Old Mill. It is illegal to "run" the dam. An additional 3.5 miles of whitewater from Eckert Bridge to Harris Bridge* can extend the run for boaters to 6 miles. (*that's the first bridge you went over at the bottom of the hill after




A BRIEF HISTORY OF VETERANS DAY

Veterans Day, formerly known as Armistice Day, was originally set as a U.S. legal holiday to honor the end of World War I, which officially took place on November 11, 1918. In legislature that was passed in 1938, November 11 was "dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be hereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day." As such, this new legal holiday honored World War I veterans.

In 1954, after having been through both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd U.S. Congress -- at the urging of the veterans service organizations -- amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, Nov. 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

In 1968, the Uniforms Holiday Bill ensured three-day weekends for federal employees by celebrating four national holidays on Mondays: Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day, and Columbus Day. Under this bill, Veterans Day was moved to the last Monday of October. Many states did not agree with this decision and continued to celebrate the holiday on its original date. The first Veterans Day under the new law was observed with much confusion on Oct. 25, 1971.

Finally on September 20, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed a law which returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of Nov. 11, beginning in 1978. Since then, the Veterans Day holiday has been observed on Nov. 11.
