## MINUTES FROM THE N.O.R.G MEETING MARCH 20, 2015

Rich Jandrey introduced our guest speaker, **Walt Szczecinski** and wife **Cindy**. Walt spoke on the life and times of Henry Ford. He started with Henry Ford taking things apart at 8 years old and putting them back together again. He got a job as a machine apprentice and took on a 2<sup>nd</sup> job doing jewelry repairs. Henry hated farming and farm work but got interested in a tractor. Shortly after Detroit Diesel hired Henry and he was allowed to use the machine shop on the off hours. Henry worked on internal combustion engines and made up bikes with gas engines. Henry got married to Clara and had a son Edsel. Henry quit Detroit Diesel and went into his own business, but filed bankruptcy three different times. He approached the Dodge Brothers and ventured into business together. He in turn gave Dodge Brothers part of his business as collateral. Henry became very successful in the Ford Motor Company. Henry had patent issues and won a case in 1911. Working conditions became so bad Henry advertised; workers could earn \$5.00 a day, but the catch was, they had to be hired and worked for six months prior before getting the \$5.00 per day. In the 1930's Henry had run in's with the union and finally signed with them in 1940. His son Edsel passed away in 1943 due to stomach cancer. At this time Henry was going to have Harry Bennett run the Ford Company. Harry was a shroud Union Guru and President Roosevelt became very worried. When Henry the 2<sup>nd</sup> became President of the Ford Motor Company, on the first day he fired Harry Bennett and the rest is history!

## THE SPRING TREK TO SPREAD EAGLE & MORE

MAY 16, 2015

The Western Reserve Chapter of the AACA invites the following car clubs: Northern Chapter of the AACA, Ohio Region Classic Car Club of America (ORCCA), Veteran Motor Car Club of America, Cadillac -LaSalle Club, Model T Club, Buick Club of America, and the Early Ford V8 Club to participate in the almost annual spring trek, this year to view an exclusive classic car collection and to lunch at the Spread Eagle Tavern in Hanoverton, Ohio.

The Spread Eagle dates back to the Canal Era of the early nineteenth century when the village of Hanoverton was a bustling stop on the Sandy & Beaver Canal. Erected in 1837, the three story Federal Period brick tavern house served as a hostelry for many a traveler and the Hanoverton townsfolk. Today, more than 170 years later and after a two year restoration, the tavern and inn have become an Ohio landmark. With its seven dining rooms and five guestrooms, the Tavern offers gourmet dining and deluxe overnight accommodations. We will be having lunch at this setting at approximately noon on May 16<sup>th</sup>.



Before lunch, we will be visiting the car collection of the owner of the Spread Eagle, David Johnson, in Salem, Ohio. Mr. Johnson's address in Salem, Ohio is 570 Highland Avenue, 44460-1804. The number 570 precedes house number 566 and is not marked. Drive to the rear. It is just before the house numbered 566 Highland which is the 14<sup>th</sup> house on the right side of the street. He has assured me that it is easily found on your GPS.

If you are interested in joining this tour, Morrie Dannenhirsh will be sending instructions on how to find his house in Salem and back to Hanoverton and the Spread Eagle closer to the departure date. Hanoverton is located approximately 65 miles from Cleveland, 35 miles east of Canton and maybe 50 miles south of Ashtabula.

"Western Reservers" know the way to Hanoverton from last year's trip. Those coming from the Cleveland departure point in Streetsboro at the Burger King on the west side SR 14 just past the Turnpike exit will get directions to both the Spread Eagle and Dave Johnson's display at the Burger King. Departure from Streetsboro at 8:30 A.M. VMCCAers know that Hanoverton is due east on U.S.Route 30. I will be providing directions to Salem and Spread Eagle later.

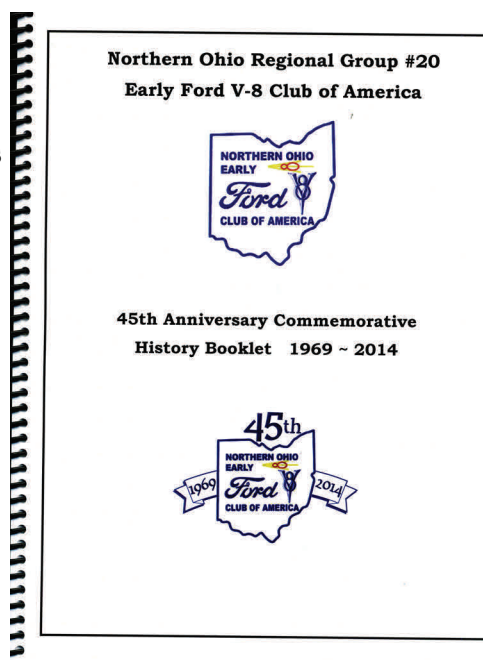
### 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary License Toppers

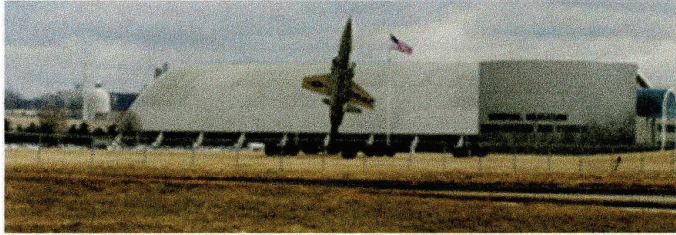
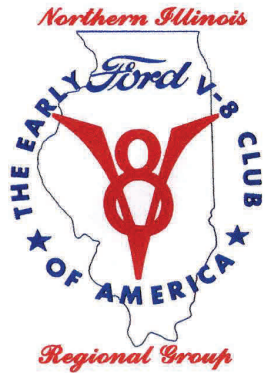
### 45<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Windshield Stickers

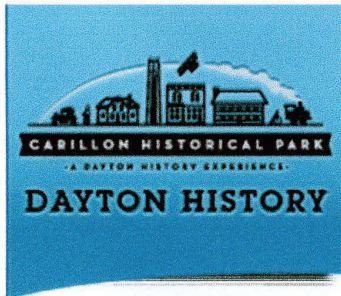




## 5TH ANNUAL JOINT TOUR WITH THE NORTHERN ILLINOIS REGIONAL GROUP

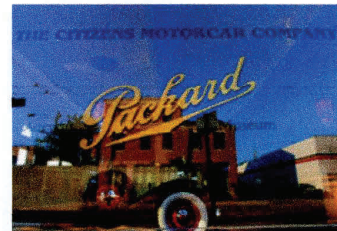

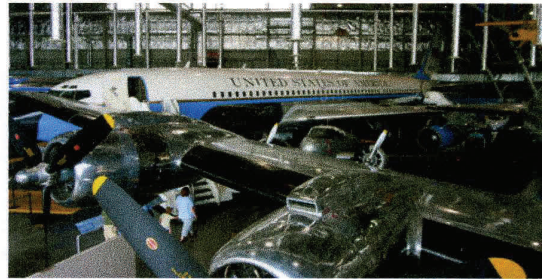

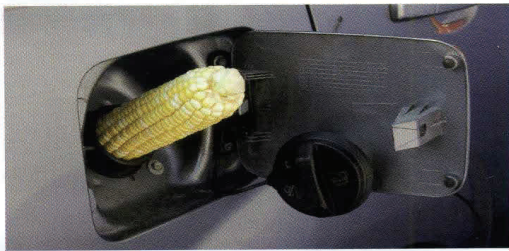

**M**uch like the state legislatures, the offices of federal lawmakers are in similar flurries of activity. Fortunately, congressional measures impacting ethanol fuel, tire-pressure monitoring systems and public lands are in the works—each benefiting car enthusiasts. Thus, the following efforts are currently being supported by the SEMA Action Network (SAN):



**E15 Ethanol:** The SAN is working to enact legislation that would cap the amount of ethanol blended into gasoline at 10% and eliminate the Renewable Fuel Standard's (RFS) corn-based ethanol requirement. The "Renewable Fuel Standard Reform Act" would protect consumers by repealing the EPA regulation that permitted fuel to be blended with ethanol at up to 15%. The bill would also eliminate a RFS mandate that 15 billion gallons of corn-based ethanol be blended into the U.S. fuel supply on an annual basis each year from 2015 through 2022. While the RFS was designed to reduce U.S. dependence on foreign oil, it did not take into consideration the fact that ethanol can cause metal corrosion and dissolve certain plastics and rubbers, especially in older cars that were not constructed with ethanol-resistant materials. The SAN has joined with more than 50 other organizations from the auto/boat industries to the food, energy and environmental community to support passage of the legislation.
