

Early Ford V-8 Club Of America Summary of the Annual Face-To-Face Board Of Directors Meeting

I hope everyone had a great holiday season and winter.

The Board of Directors held our annual Face-To-Face meeting in Dearborn, MI. in February. The Board of Directors voted on Dearborn as the location, to help us further prepare for the 2018 Grand National Meet. The Board meeting was held at the Edward Hotel where the Meet will be located. We were fortunate to have a few guests on hand for our meetings.

The meeting started with the swearing in of new officers. There are no new Directors this year. Ken Bounds replaced John McBurney as the National Chief Judge.

A confirmation vote was affirmed regarding the removal of the Write-In portion of the Regional Director ballots.

David Rehor presented the Club's Financial Reports. The Club is still in great standing financially despite a loss in the 2017 year.

Joe Reger reported on the Club's book sales. The sales have dropped by a small degree. The present 1940 Book inventory is now depleted and will not be reprinted.

Joyce Parsons presented the Membership report which included all of 2017. There was a significant membership loss in the fall of 2017. This was due to the cleaning up of the membership list as there were some duplicate listings. The Membership total as of 12/31 was 8,007. **PLEASE NOTE....** Some members have purchased lifetime memberships. Lifetime membership's count on the membership totals even if the member has deceased. Jerry Windle reported on the V-8 Times. We are still on the active hunt for youth articles. If there is a younger member in your RG group, maybe consider submitting a article about the member. He has high hopes for great photos and articles in the 2018 issues.

The Board passed a vote for the sale of 50 years worth of V-8 Times available electronically via a USB flash. Look for it to be available in the next few months. The Club's current in development technical books were discussed. The Mercury book is still coming along with progress. The Flathead Engine Album is currently being compiled and edited. The 33-34 book is still in the research stage.

For 2019 we currently only have one National Meet scheduled. It is in Auburn, IN at the home of the Early Ford Foundation. Please if you RG group has a interest in hosting a National Meet reach out to us! George Mercer was in attendance on behalf of the Foundation. They are making great strides at their expansion. We will all be excited to see it's completion in 2019! They are currently raffling off a Brand New F-150 Pickup!

A New policy was put in place to allow your director to grant you permission for the use of the Club's logo. The previous procedure was that the permission had to be granted through a Board vote.

We spent the entire day on Wednesday discussing the 2018 Grand National Meet. We are expecting this to be one to remember. As of 2/24 we have 265 registrations. Please fill out and mail in your registration form if you plan to attend! Details about the meet are available on the Club's website.


Our next meeting is May 19th. If your RG group staff positions have changed please inform me. Happy V8'ing!

Advertising for the '41 Ford



One aspect of the old car hobby for many people is collecting paper related to cars they own or would like to own. That would include owner's manuals, shop manuals, reference books, and advertising. I was surprised when I first found a few advertising pieces for the 41 Ford, one of two Fords I own, by how well they stand the test of time. The advertising is just beautiful!

The color rendering of a '41 Fordor shown on this month's cover is from an ad that ran in *Life* magazine, *Saturday Evening Post*, and *U.S. News* in July of 1940, sort of a sneak preview for the fall introduction of the new '41 Ford lineup.

The other images on this page are from a beautiful 25-1/2" x 22" color press sheet, printed both sides, that folds into 12 8-1/2" x 11" pages. All the images are color renderings rather than photos. My guess that these beautiful brochures would have been given out by dealers to prospective buyers who stopped by to look at the new models. I have two of these brochures and one has a dealer stamp on the cover—Ripley Motors Inc., Portland, Maine.

To me it looks like some artistic license was taken with some of the artwork to make the features look even better than they were. Take for instance the one showing the interior roominess of the interior of the Fordor or the one of the three adults setting in the backseat with room to spare.

Where do you find collectible paper? A swap meet like the indoor one just held on February 25th at the Washington County Fairgrounds is a good source (see the report on the next page) or any large car show—Iola, Jefferson, Elkhorn to name a few local ones.—*Russ Larson*


