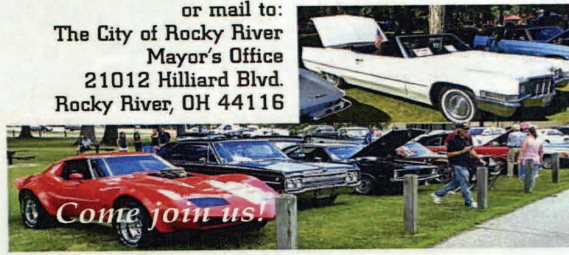

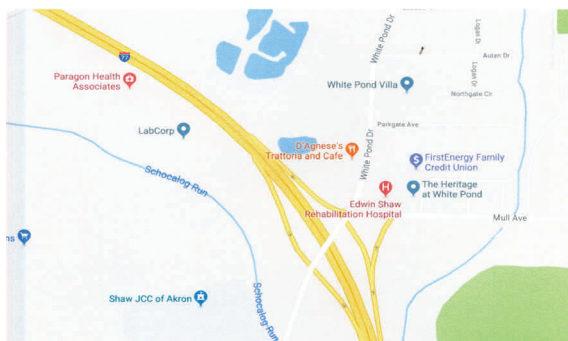
New directions from New Castle area on 422 East-
