



Stripped almost naked and ready for action.

THIS mint bodied Ford was dry shed stored in Dallas, Texas for 30° years. I bought it from Jerry Vincentini (EFV8 club World Chief Judge) whilst at the July 2008 Dearborn, USA Grand National.


I am the third owner and Jerry the second. Jerry had started the restoration.

The I/D numbers matched the VIN # 799A1616846, Body # D42928.

The vehicle eventually arrived in Australia in October, 2008 and was transported to my home in Vermont South, Melbourne.

My original intention was to just get it going after attending to the safety items BUT, although my wife Sandy liked the body style, she was unsure about the colour, so wouldn't you know it; a full body-aff restoration began.

Once on the hoist, stripping the body panels progressed well, only four body

bolts refused to budge!! These were holding the running boards to the body. No other refusals.

Total dismantling proved this car was the finest of all Fords I have seen.

Off came the front sheet metal/front and rear fenders/all chrome and stainless. The engine was craned off, front and rear ends/drive components dropped.

The bare chassis is TOTALLY rust free except for some slight surface rust.

All parts were stripped and ready for sand/media blasting and powder coating.

The body/bonnet/boot covers remain in my garage waiting on the painter. NO CORROSION was found on the sheet metal parts. Not even on the window reveals!

I am not too concerned about the mechanical works. The body is the most expensive to repair.

All chrome and stainless steel/window frames etc. are refurbished and ready.


Next stages: Body and panels media blasting, engine/gearbox/ suspension etc. rebuilds.

It is a labour of love and keeps me off the street BUT family time takes precedence!



Restoration of my 1947 Tudor Part 2 By Peter Hibbert



Body is at last on the chassis frame for door fit etc. The colour is a close match to a 48 Ford Tudor I have seen twice at the Dearborn Grand National.

Back to business:-

THE body fit and finish is now perfect, probably better than factory original

The only components yet to be finished and painted are the doors, boot lid and bonnet.

As the body underside was original, I found a metallic green colour under the floor pan.

The Ford factory may have used any colour at hand for this and I duplicated the colour and finish.

"All the interior components are painted in a contrasting colour and stored to harden the paint.


The condition of these components was excellent but required me to 'fiddle' with most to refine. The chassis frame is now stripped from the body and back on my garage hoist for final fitting of brake lines, brake components, wiring, front to rear and other works difficult to access after bady is on.

The engine is built to long motor' stage ready for my spray painting. Other parts to fit after that.


The gearbox assembly will be next as new bearings and gasket kit etc are now in stock.

The gearbox case is painted the correct blue and on a home made plywood stand ready for assembly.

All other parts are painted/plated/re-chromed, polished, sub-assembled ready to fit.



Body interior viewed from the near window. The floor top through to the boot space is black. Beyond is body colour,




The colour match and finish of the original Ford factory under-floor painting.


The running board bases are painted ready to adhere the repro' rubbers. It is a job not to be rushed. The assembly instructions are three pages with lots of caution notes!

Not one component, nut, bolt, self-tapping scnew, setscrew, bolt etc escaped restoration.

I am a believer in using Henry's original hardware is the quality of his metallurgy is high.



Right hand inside door. The Ford factory 'joggle' to the diagonal door brace to bring in the door bottom to fit. On our final fit, it was found to be .003 mm away from alignment. Another method was used to bring it in flush.




Demonstrating the versatility and ease of painting the body utilizing a rotisserie.


Make your own comparison of new Asian supplied hardware and see for yourself.
