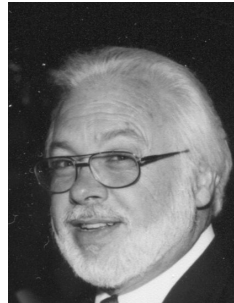

MINUTES FOR THE MEETING OF March 18, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by president Jack Bukszar. Jack started the meeting by asking members to introduce themselves and their cars.

Beth Schilling introduced Jeff Film, Chief of Police of the city of Stow. Chief Film was presented with a check for our annual donation to the city, which we give each year as a token of our appreciation for use of the meeting room in the City Safety Building. Chief Film told us that our donation will be added to a fund that the city will use to construct a memorial to first responders. The memorial will be a way to show appreciation for the fact that first responders regularly risk their lives in order to keep the rest of us safe.

Our speaker for the evening was Chris Harrell. Chris has a business supplying parts for 1936-1948 Lincolns. He got into this business after he was laid off from a regular job. Having restored several Mustangs, he was familiar with the old car world and decided to go for it when the opportunity came up to buy out an antique Lincoln parts dealer. Chris provided an interesting history of the development of his parts business, which included moving truckloads of parts from Yardley, Pennsylvania, to St. Louis, Missouri, and then to Cleveland, Ohio, as business and other opportunities presented themselves. He noted that Henry Ford can be credited with, among other things, creating the replacement parts industry due to his use of standardized parts on the assembly line. Ford also developed detailed training manuals that instructed dealers on how to run their dealerships efficiently and profitably. Among other things, dealers were told that if a part did not sell within 18 months it should be regarded as obsolete and be gotten rid of. Chris presented an example of a 1935 filmstrip Ford sent to dealers to show them how their parts department should be run. Chris informed us that detailed descriptions and drawings of parts can still be obtained from The Henry Ford.com., although there is a charge for them.

Secretary Neal Garland read the minutes from the February meeting. Rick Jandrey moved that the minutes be accepted as read. Second by Steve Kronen. The minutes were approved.

Co-treasurers Dan and Diane Francis reported that even though the Mega Millions tickets they bought didn't win, we do still have money in our treasury. Jeep Iacobucci moved that the treasurers' report be accepted as presented. Second by Rick Jandrey. The report was accepted.

President Jack Bukszar reported on the Board of Directors meeting that was held at Simon's Restaurant in Brecksville on March 14. The Board moved that **Frank Posar** be assigned the position of **Vice President**. Frank accepted the position. A number of possible activities for the summer were discussed. Details on these activities will be presented in future issues of the Headliner.

National Director Steve Kronen reminded us that the Eastern National Meet will be held in Franklin, Tennessee, on June 1-5. Registration information can be found in the V8 Times, on line at the national's website, and in the March issue of the Headliner.

Regis Schilling reported that our website is doing fine. He has not had any new problems with it and it has not been hacked. Recently.

Neal Garland reported that our first lunch outing for 2022 was held on March 14 at D'Agnese's Italian Restaurant in Akron. Nine hungry NORG'ers showed up to enjoy excellent Italian food and the companionship of fellow club members after the long "no lunch" spell forced on us by the pandemic.

President Jack informed us that the Board of Directors discussed the possibility of holding a club activity in conjunction with the 2022 Great Race when it stops to pick up lunch in Medina on June 21. However, it was decided this would not be possible given the tight schedule that the racers must follow. Club members are encouraged to view the race activities on an individual basis if they are interested.

Bruce Lewicki announced that we are invited to join the Nifty Fifties' brief tour to the Skyway Drive In Restaurant on May 21. See the May Headliner for details.

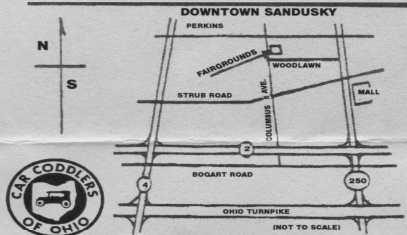

The "Great Race" Stops In Medina Tuesday June 21st

Members are all invited to see the participants arrive in Medina. It will be their decision if they wish to come.

Below is information on the history and background of the Great Race


In the 39-year history of the Great Race, the event has made its way east and west and north and south through 46 of the 48 contiguous United States. In 2022, the Great Race will finally be able to add the last two states to its schedule – Rhode Island and North Dakota.

The 2022 Hemmings Motor News Great Race presented by Hagerty Drivers Club will start in Warwick, Rhode Island, on Saturday, June 18, and finish in Fargo, North Dakota, on Sunday, June 26, race organizers have announced. The 9-day, 2,300-mile adventure will bring 120 of the world's finest antique automobiles to 19 cities in Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota and North Dakota. More than \$150,000 will be awarded to top finishers in multiple divisions.

Teams and cars from Japan, England, Australia, Canada and every corner of the United States will converge in Rhode Island in mid-June with vintage automobiles dating back as far as 1916. There are more than 500 people just in our entourage from all around the world

The Great Race, which began 39 years ago, is not a speed race, but a time/speed/distance rally. The vehicles, each with a driver and navigator, are given precise instructions each day that detail every move down to the second. They are scored at secret check points along the way and are penalized one second for each second either early or late. As in golf, the lowest score wins.

Cars built in 1974 and earlier are eligible, with most entries having been manufactured before World War II. In the 2019 Great Race a 1916 Hudson won the event from Riverside, Calif., to Tacoma, Wash. The 2022 winners will again receive \$50,000 of the \$150,000 total purse. A 1916 Hudson Pikes Peak Hill-climber, a 1917 American LaFrance and a 1917 Peerless racer are the oldest cars scheduled to be in the 2021 Great Race from San Antonio, Texas, to Greenville, S.C., this summer.

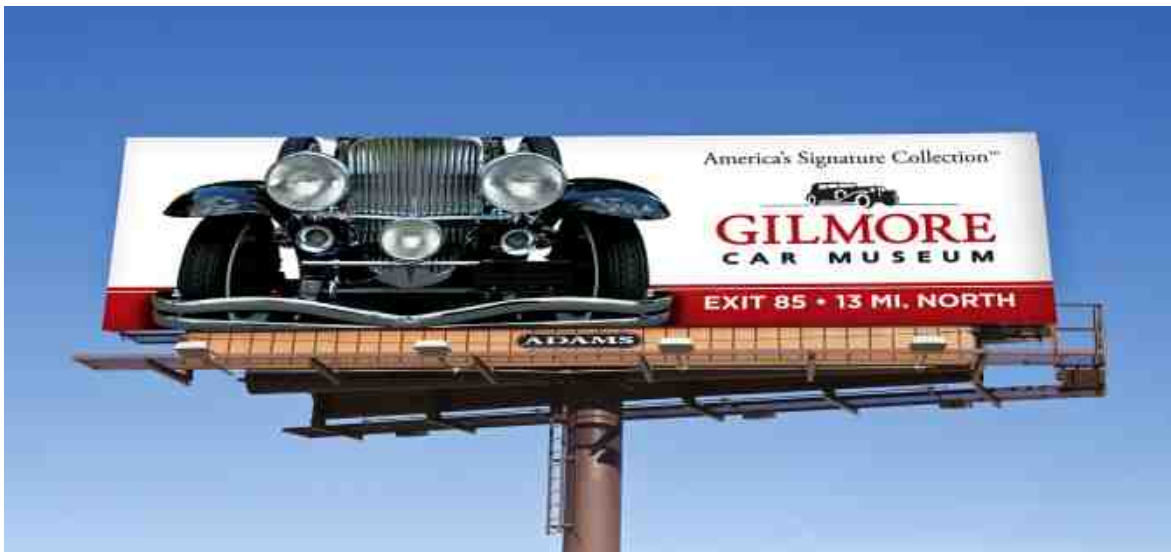


President's Plan for RG Presidents Zoom Call
