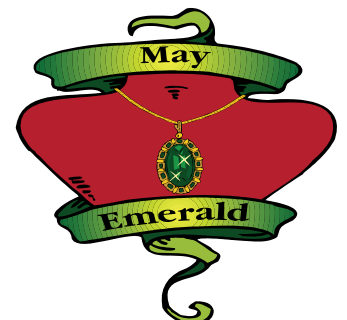

The program for the evening was on Antique Insurance. Kim Todd was introduced and is from Mobile Insurance Agency. Kim sells Haggerty Antique car Insurance through her agency. Kim attends many car shows and events throughout the local areas selling this insurance.

Haggerty Insurance requirements are:

- The antique car can have unlimited mileage, but must be driven only for shows, meets, etc. not as an everyday driver.
- You can submit a claim to Haggerty for your car; even if you repair it yourself.
- Haggerty Insurance does not take cars and scrap them. If the repair is paid, you are welcome to keep the car.
- The Liability coverage is year round.
- You can receive multi-car discounts.
- There is a yearly renewal fee and if you want to increase the coverage, it can be done at this time.
- Haggerty insures race cars – will not cover when racing or in staging area or running down the track.
- Cars are covered when trailered to and from a meet and in the garage.
- The insurance will cover tow trucks – only uses flat beds to get you off the road to a safer place. Will only travel 25 miles.
- An odometer reading is not required.
- The cars to be insured do not have to be appraised, but a requirement is to have a picture of the car and the VIN number.

Haggerty Insurance will take care of the collector's car needs! If you are involved in an accident, no matter who is at fault your coverage will not go up.

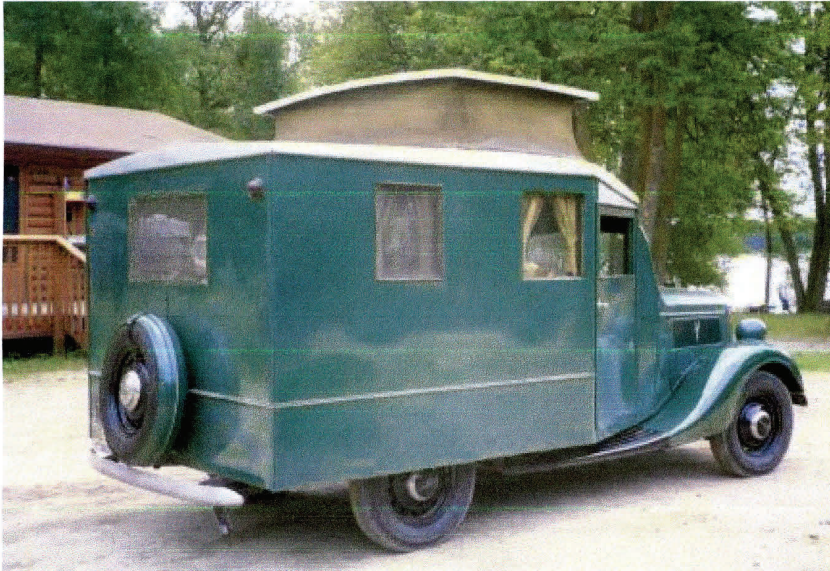

The Ford House car, 1937

Powered by 60 hp Ford Flat-Head V8 !!!!....



This is one of only six Ford House-cars said to have been made per year in the mid-30's at the Ford plant in St. Paul, Minnesota, according to an article in a 1993 "Old Cars" magazine.

Very few others--perhaps none--remain on the road and certainly not in such amazing original condition! When discovered in a garage under a heavy cover in northern Minnesota in August of 2001, it had only 19,000 miles on the odometer and the owner's manual was still in the glove box in like-new condition!

The RV had always been garaged and treated with much 'TLC' as a collector vehicle.

The all wood lined interior was still the way it appeared in the '30's complete with framed photos of the original owner on his travels, mainly to Florida, and his cabin in the North Woods. It also had other memorabilia from that era.

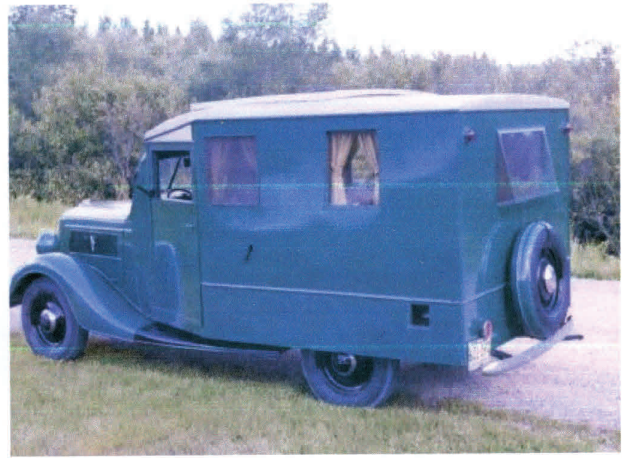
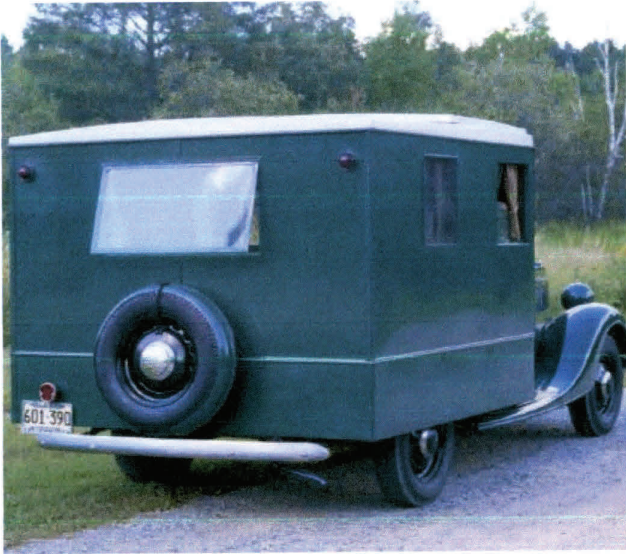
The Ford House-car was built on a '37 Ford Pickup frame and cowl and was powered by a 60 horse power, flat head V-8 with aluminum heads. The rear framing is all wood, with the metal skin wrapped around it. The roof structure is all wood over which the heavy, waterproofed canvas top is still very securely fitted. The structure of the body is solid, appearing to be all oak hardwood and it's still in a remarkably unaltered, undamaged condition!

The door frames are thick, solid oak as are the window frames although those have been painted over.

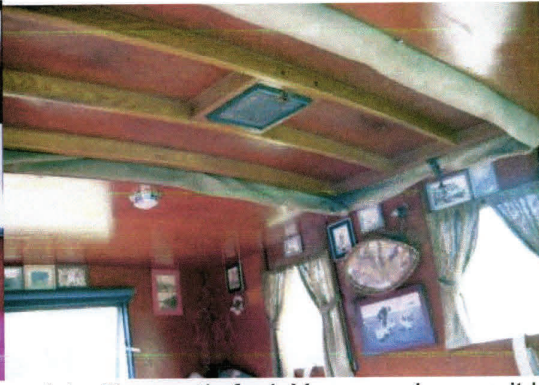
This House-car was a big hit at this campground once we got that great old 'flattie' V-8 hummin'! Note the expanding roof (it's that 'extra' roof piece barely visible in the picture) and the original dark green color, which has been repainted. All four side windows open while the back one tilts out in three positions. The windshield also tilts open at the bottom for 'natural' AC while driving.

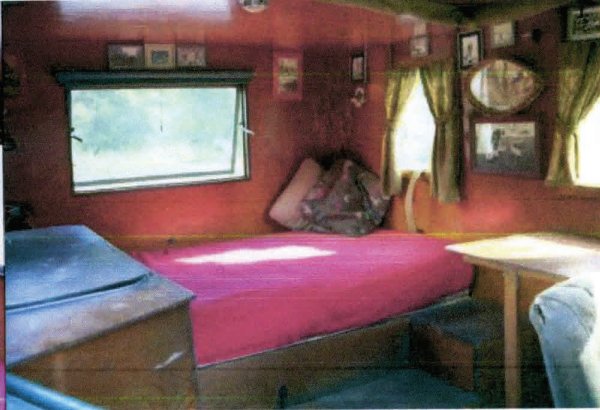


Here's a look at the interior. It's a slice right out of 1930's just as the original owner had it. All the windows have curtains for privacy and there are pull-down shades on the back window, as well as on the driver's and passenger door windows. Note the wide storage cabinet under the bed



The wood headliner gives the 'cabin' a warm and inviting rustic feel. You can also see it has a ceiling vent and the canvas expanding roof portion visible in this picture. Four wood pieces securely support the expansion when it's in the 'up' position, while clamps secure it when it's down while traveling.

Note the cedar branches hanging in the corners to give the cabin a natural, north woods aroma. Cabinets and the aluminum sink, that includes a wooden cover insert, are visible on the left. All the antiques inside, as well as on the walls, came along for the ride. Also note the collapsible table behind the driver's seat.



It's amazing how simple vehicles were back then! No computerization to be concerned about, eh?

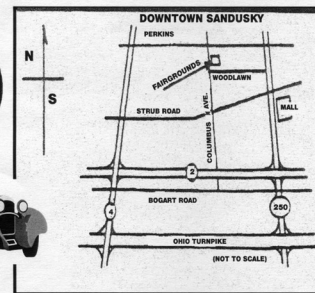

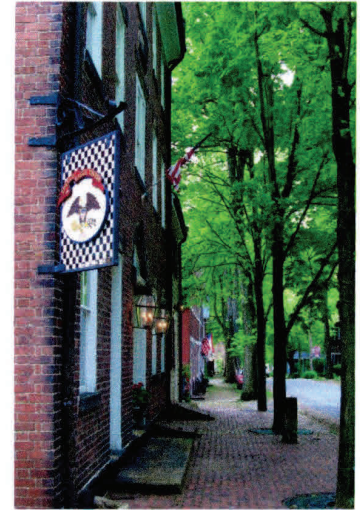

A Tour to the Packard Museum, the Spread Eagle Tavern & More Saturday, May 31, 2014

NORG has been invited to join a group of other car clubs to participate in the spring trek, to the Packard Museum in Warren, Ohio and the Spread Eagle Tavern in Hanoverton, Ohio.

The Spread Eagle dates back to the Canal Era of the early nineteenth century when the village of Hanoverton was a bustling stop on the Sandy & Beaver Canal. Erected in 1837, the three story Federal Period brick tavern house served as a hostelry for many a traveler and the Hanoverton townsfolk. Today, more than 170 years later and after a two year restoration, the tavern and inn has become an Ohio landmark. With its seven dining rooms and five guestrooms, the Tavern offers gourmet dining and deluxe overnight accommodations. We will be having lunch at this setting between 12:30 and 1 PM on May 31st.

Before lunch, we will be visiting the National Packard Museum in Warren, Ohio. In addition to the many Packards which we would love to own, there is now on exhibit the Museum's 14th annual Motorcycle Exhibit. The exhibit illustrates engineering advances made to the machines in each decade of the Twentieth Century. Admission over 65 is \$5.00. The Packard Museum is located on SR 45, Mahoning Ave., just past the intersection with SR 45. Please plan to arrive at 10:00 AM. Directions to the Spread Eagle will be passed out at the Packard Museum.

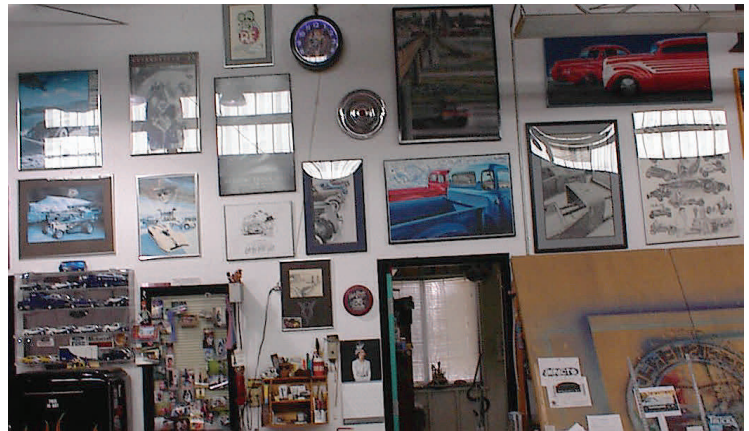
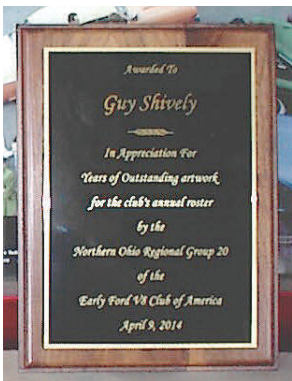


Visit to Guy Shively's Studio

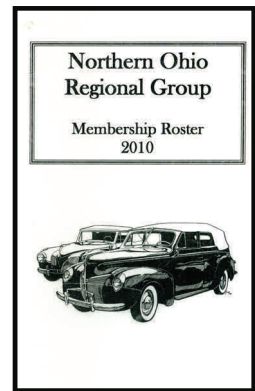
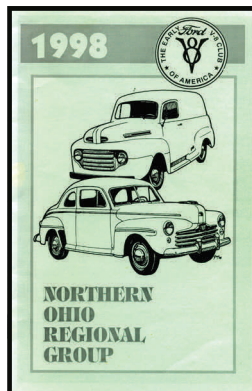
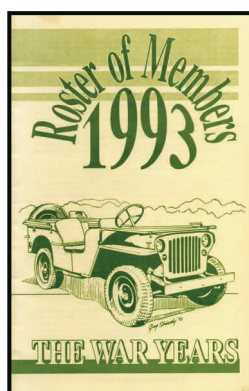
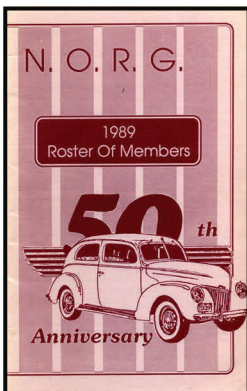
