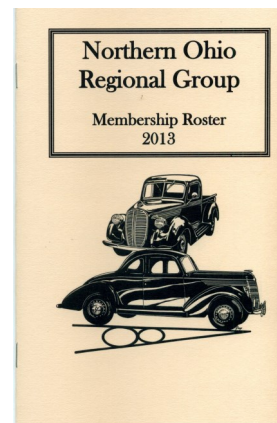
Richard owns a 1935 Ford Convertible Sedan, a 1938 Ford Station Wagon and a 1947 Ford Convertible.

Tony Gray, who with his wife Merry Lou recently joined the NORG, sent us this photo of his 1952 Ford 1/2 Ton Pick-up.

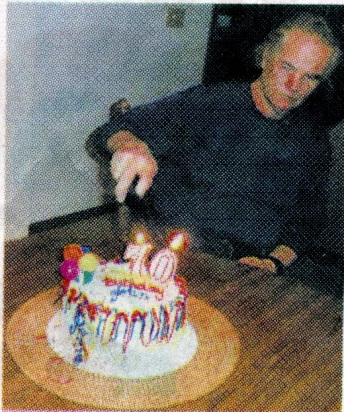

These will be strictly informal come-if-you-feel-like-it activities. There usually will be no reserved tables or other special arrangements with the restaurants. Everyone will order individually. **Unless you are notified of a change in time, plan to meet at the scheduled spots at 11:00 a.m.**

Tuesday, March 19: Mike's Place, 1700 S. Water Street, Kent, Ohio. Phone 330-673-6501. (Water Street is also State Route 43. Mike's Place is located at the intersection of Route 43 and Route 261. Take Interstate 76 and exit north on 43 toward Kent. Mike's Place is on the west side of 43 and is easy to spot because it has what looks like a jet airplane on a pedestal in the parking lot.)

Mike's Place can best be described as a "funky" restaurant with a very eclectic decor. The tone of the place is reflected in some of the "Rules of Mike's Place," which are posted on their website (Mikesplace.com). A sampling of the rules includes:

- Mike is always right (just don't ask his wife).
- Tips may be thrown at cooks (in appreciation or as an incentive to never cook again)
- Thou shalt control thy children or we will provide duct tape.
- No making motorboat noises in your beer.

Thursday, April 25: Cathedral Buffet, 2960 State Road, Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio. Phone 330-922-0467. Directions to find the Cathedral Buffet will be provided in the April newsletter. We visited this spot last year and everyone seemed to enjoy the \$7 buffet, so let's do it again. MAYBE the weather will be nice enough in April so we can drive our V8s and take advantage of the huge parking lot.

Thursday, May 23: Shisler's Cheese House, 1275 S. Cleveland-Massillon Road, Copley, Ohio. Phone 330-665-3434. Shisler's is a small local spot that sells—of all things—cheese. It also has a very nice deli-style counter service where you can custom order a sandwich and a drink. There is both indoor and outdoor seating and surely the weather will be OK for driving our V8s! Next door to Shisler's is an ice cream shop and a craft-type gift shop, so after lunch some ice cream and some shopping will be in order. Please let me know of other restaurants that you think would be good places for us to visit. I'm open to all suggestions!

Irish Soda Bread Recipe

Ingredients:

2 Cups all-purpose Flour
2 Tablespoons Brown Sugar
1 Teaspoon Baking Powder
1 Teaspoon Baking Soda
1/2 Teaspoon Salt
3 Tablespoons Butter
2 Eggs
3/4 Cup Buttermilk
1/3 Cup Raisin

Directions:

In a large bowl, combine flour, brown sugar, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Cut in butter until crumbly. In a small bowl, whisk 1 egg and buttermilk. Stir into flour mixture just until moistened. Fold in raisins.

Knead on a floured surface for 1 minute. Shape into a round loaf ; place on a greased baking sheet. Cut 1/4 inch deep cross in top of loaf. Beat remaining egg; brush over loaf

Bake at 375 for 30-35 minutes or until golden brown

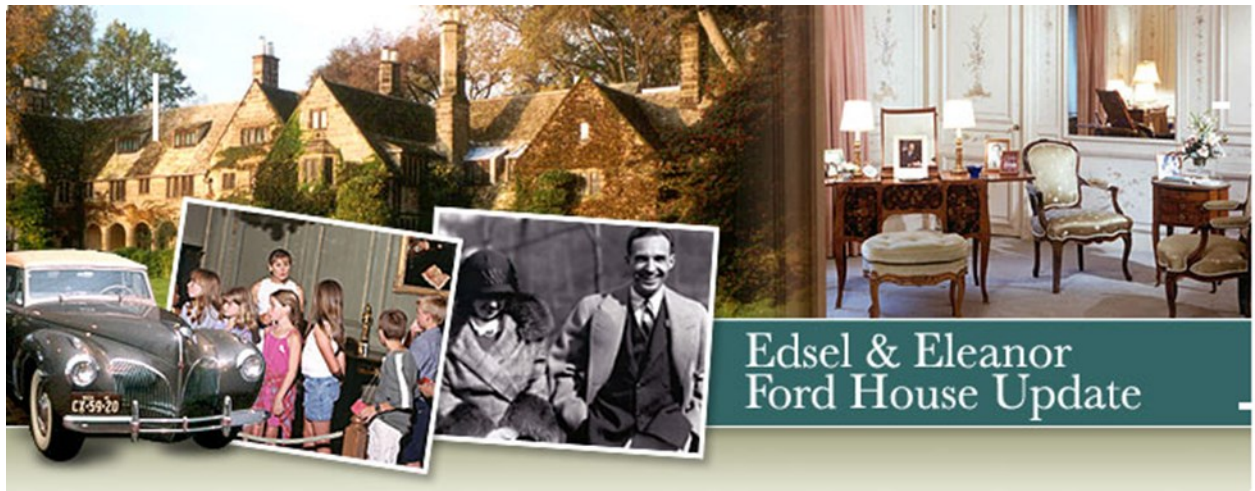
