Bill's business consists of re-keying, service and the selling of safes. Bill explained about the key market today with no way for replacements. The market has turned into a throw away society. Bump keys are very popular and can open almost any lock. The Defiant lock company has only twelve different keys that are made. This company depends on the ignorance of people that do not know the difference. Schlage is a good lock and Arrow is the best. When looking in the phone book for a locksmith; stay away from the 24 hour locksmith. Almost all vehicles now have keyless entry. When a new key fob is needed order from a locksmith not thru your dealership. You will save a lot of money. Also, Bill said you should open your vehicles doors with the regular key at least once a month. This is a good habit to get into and in the case of an emergency and you know your locks will work when needed. Always use WD-40 for your locks not regular oil.

Bill explained about Brinks, Honeywell and Sentry are not good safes to purchase. They are flooding today's market. When purchasing a safe, look for the fire rating and make sure it is UL listed. In ending his presentation Bill said you get what you pay for in security.

- GRISSOM AIR PARK & MUSEUM Named for Indiana native Virgil "Gus" Grissom, the second American astronaut to fly in space. This museum has an outdoor display of approximately 20 aircraft and an indoor museum containing artifacts related to the 305th Bomber Group and interesting sit-in displays, including cockpits of a replica 1903 Wright flyer, a UH-1L Huey Helicopter, and a F-4C Phantom. Admission: \$2 per person
- **ELWOOD HAYNES MUSEUM** Former home of Elwood Haynes who is credited with developing the first commercially built automobile in America (1893-4) and with the Apperson brothers formed the first company in the United States to produce automobiles profitably. Many of Haynes' original inventions and automobiles are housed in the Museum. Admission: **Donations: \$1 \$2 per person**
- SEIBERLING MANSION In 1887, Monroe Seiberling of Akron, OH (and uncle of Goodyear Tire and Rubber Co. co-founder, Frank Seiberling) opened the Kokomo Strawboard Co., a maker of shoeboxes, and later, the Diamond Plate Glass Co. Construction of the Mansion a mixture of Neo-Jacobean (Queen Anne) and Romanesque Revival styles- took two years (1989-91) at a cost of \$50,000. \$35 per person, dinner and tour. - **KOKOMO AUTOMOTIVE MUSEUM** More than 100 classic/vintage cars, vintage advertising, clothing, antiques, a great collection of signage and memorabilia relevant to the history of these cars, a 1950s diner, and a service station diorama. **\$3 per person.**
- JAMES DEAN MEMORIAL GALLERY- Housed in a beautifully restored 1890 Victorian home resting on a nostalgic tree-lined street, literally thousands of items of James Dean memorabilia reflect on the short life and career of one of the most remembered personalities in film history. 

INFORMATION REGARDING 10% ETHANOL BLENDED GASOLINE

What Older Engine Components Are Affected By the 10% Ethanol: According to information published by the Renewable Fuels Association that states: "The results from the tests with carburetors and fuel pumps suggest that E10 (10% Ethanol) can be used in older vehicles, although the owner is likely to be faced with additional costs associated with sealing fuel tanks and cleaning and rebuilding fuel systems more frequently than in the past." There were materials listed which are incompatible (reactive to) Ethanol: Zinc, Brass, Lead, Aluminum, Terne (lead-in alloy common in older OEM fuel tanks), lead based solder, natural rubber, polyurethane, cork gasket material, leather, polyvinyl chloride (PVC), polyamides, methylmethacrylate plastics, and polyester-bonded fiberglass laminates.

Reminder to Check the Rubber Sleeve Connection the Fuel Tank to Fuel Filler Neck: If your V-8 is mid 37 or newer you should check the rubber sleeve that connects the fill neck to the tank. If this has never been changed or changed many years ago it is probably starting to deteriorate due to this new gas. It will clog your fuel pump, carburetor etc. as small pieces of rubber begin to flake off and land in the tank. If you remove the sleeve and find that the rubber turns black in your hand, rub the debris between your




Joint Trip; Northern Ohio & Greater Pittsburgh Regional Groups
