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Minutes from the N.O.R.G. Meeting, September 21st 2012

Before the regular scheduled meeting, President Jeep Iacobucci called a Board meeting. The main topic of discussion was the updated by-laws. The by-laws had to be updated due to the tax exempt qualification the V-8 club needs. The by-laws did need to be updated and will be presented to the membership at the next meeting for a vote. The Board also discussed a donation to the Stow safety center of \$250.00 for the usage of the hall each month. It perhaps can ear marked for shrubs/landscape or other beneficial items the safety center may need. The November pizza party was discussed and Annette Gorris and Ginnie Herrmann will research a date and place for the December Christmas party.

President, Jeep Iacobucci called the meeting to order at 7:45 PM. The membership made their introductions and our guests this evening were: John Coleman, Jr. and new members Bruce and Marie Lewicki.

A thank you goes to Mike and Liz Wisniewski for the coffee and goodies for the meeting.

Rich Jandrey introduced Frank Seme of SEME & SON ENGINE BUILDERS. Frank has been in business for approximately 40 years in Euclid, Ohio and has seen many changes through the years. He works on the older project cars. Many of the knowledgeable individuals who have worked on older cars have passed away. He is available for these projects and also does warranty work on many of the newer automobiles.

Frank works on engine rebuilding. He has had problems with trying to obtain USA parts rather than China. China of course is cheaper but, the quality isn't good and you are always trying to make the parts work. Some of the engine work Frank will do is: crankshaft grinding/boring, reconditioning rods, replacing timing and refurbishing engine bushings are to list a few. Frank put together a 1918 Winton that was in boxes and had no instruction. His great accomplishment was to get the car together and running.

Frank spoke on oil and strongly suggests using a good mineral oil that contains zinc. For the older cars he uses 20/50 Brad Penn oil. (Which is the old Kendall Oil Company in Bradford, PA.) Many bearings float on oil and if you want your car to run a life time, use quality oil. Always check the oil and if you see a label that has a circle that says "API" Automotive Petroleum Institute this is for newer cars because the zinc has been removed.

Frank then began speaking on fuel. Alcohol that is added is purely a cleaning agent and the alcohol deteriorates the rubber gaskets and many parts in your car. He also explained that you can not purchase a carburetor kit anymore from the US. They are all china made. Frank also explained that the product STABLE is not as good as it used to be. Frank is located at East 260th Street in Euclid and if you should have any questions he would be glad to help.

Ginnie Herrmann read the August minutes. The minutes were approved by Mike Wisniewski and seconded by Bill Royer.







The grille and bumper designs grouped below are from late-1940's and early-1950's Fords.



Charles Taylor, the Wright Brothers & Henry Ford.

Charles E. Taylor, 1868-1956---by Bob Taylor

Three men (not two) were involved in the invention and development of the first powered airplane - that's right, three. Everyone knows about the Wright brothers, but that third man was Charles E. "Charlie" Taylor, a quiet genius who loved cigars and the sound of machinery. He built the Wind Tunnel for tests, the revolutionary light weight motor- from scratch, the hanger and workshop, all the metal fittings that held the plane together and the first prop that wouldn't delaminate at speed.

Although he contributed to one of man's greatest achievements, "Powered Flight," his name was almost lost in aviation history. And if it hadn't been for Charlie that first powered airplane would never have gotten off the ground. Charlie Taylor's contribution to aviation was forgotten until 1937 when Henry Ford was reconstructing the old Wright bicycle shop in Dearborn, MI.

Detectives found Charlie working at North American Aviation in Los Angeles for 37 cents an hour. None of his co-workers realized he had built the first aircraft engine. Charlie worked for Ford until 1941 when he returned to California and worked 60 hours a week in a defense factory. However, in 1945 Charlie suffered a heart attack and was never able to work again.

In November 1955, a reporter discovered Charlie in Los Angeles General Hospital's charity ward--he was almost destitute. His income was his Social Security and an \$800 a year annuity fund belatedly established by Orville Wright before his death in 1948. The aviation industry immediately started a campaign to raise funds for Charlie. He was moved to a private sanitarium where he died a few months later on January 30, 1956, at the age of 88.
