How about this for some of that left-over turkey

Turkey Pot Pies with Herbed Phyllo Crust

This recipe offers a combination of leftover roast turkey and vegetables with a creamy sauce. Served under layers of delicate phyllo pastry sprinkled with savory herbs

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 can (14 ounces) chicken broth
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 cup frozen peas

2 cups leftover roasted vegetables, chopped into bite sized pieces (or 2 cups frozen mixed vegetables)

- 4 tablespoons chopped fresh herbs (such as parsley and dill)
- 3 cups leftover turkey, chopped into bite sized pieces
- 8 sheets phyllo dough, thawed according to package instructions
- Olive oil spray
- Salt and pepper, to taste

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° F. Spray four individual gratin dishes (or 8-ounce ramekins) with olive oil spray.
- 2. In a large skillet, over medium heat, melt butter with 2 tablespoons olive oil. Add onion, and sauté 5 minutes or until soft. Reduce heat to low, and sprinkle flour over onions. Cook, whisking constantly for 3 minutes.
- 3. Whisk in chicken broth, salt, pepper and Worcestershire sauce, and bring to a boil.
- 4. Remove from heat. Add peas, chopped vegetables, 2 tablespoons herbs and turkey. Mix well and taste for seasoning. Divide between prepared gratin dishes or ramekins.
- 5. Lay one phyllo sheet on a large cutting board. Working quickly, spray with olive oil spray and sprinkle with a small amount of chopped fresh herbs. Top with the next sheet of phyllo, spray and sprinkle with herbs. Repeat with two more phyllo sheets, ending with a sheet sprayed with oil, but not sprinkled with herbs.
- 6. Using a pizza cutter or a sharp knife cut the phyllo stacks in half widthwise. Place each on a gratin dish and fold and crimp the edges to fit the dish. Cut a slit in the center of each crust. Repeat with the four remaining phyllo sheets, herbs and two remaining gratin dishes.

Bake 20-25 minutes or until golden brown. Let stand 5 minutes, and serve.
